The Wahooligans and the Snoozlers

This story is mostly a listening story. It becomes interactive when small polished stones are handed out. Forest friends are invited to sing *Magical Stone* while Emmy and friends pass out stones. Forest friends will also be invited to say silly words together for fun (it might get loud with silliness and laughter). Singing and saying words are optional.

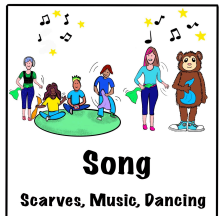


The Legend of the Accidental Grumpalumpagus Curse

This story is an interactive story. Forest friends will borrow colorful scarves for structured dancing and movement as they use their imaginations to try to break a "grumpy curse." Music, without vocals, is played through an amplifier. Dancing and movement is optional.

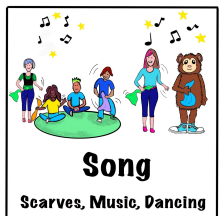


Forest friends will use their imaginations and call out the Squatchie onto the stage using a silly rhyme. The Squatchie is a safe forest friend who will remain on stage during the show. Sometimes prior introduction helps with the visual impact of seeing the Squatchie. Wide Mouthed Rainbow Frog

Due to the show's interactive features, timing depends on the audience. If the show moves as scheduled, forest friends will learn a few storytelling tricks so they can tell the classic tale (with a Squatchie twist), *Wide Mouthed Frog*. This story will be omitted if there is not enough time.



Goodbye

Sensory Guide

Total Duration: 45-minutes for structured program, 15-minutes for meet and greet

Visual Impact:

The backdrop remains consistent throughout the show

No screens or moving media images are used

Song lyrics are posted on stage

Visual schedule is posted on stage

Auditory Impact:

Background music and nature sounds (e.g. birds) are played using an amplifier

Amplifier can be lowered upon request

The show invites audience members to sing along during songs

The volume ranges from loud to medium loud depending on audience participation

Sensory Impact:

The show invites dancing and movement with colorful acrylic and silk scarves

Dancing and movement intensity depends on the audience

Polished stones are given to forest friends and can provide tactile feedback during the show

Forest friends may keep one stone to take home (Note choking and swallowing risks!)

Sensory Safe Station: The Squatchie Show coloring pages, books, fidgets, and headphones are available at a table set at the back of the audience space. Families are welcome to visit the station and borrow supplies as needed.

Physical Safety Notes: Please keep out of the taped off area ("the stage") during the program. The Squatchie and friends have limited vision, hearing, and mobility and the set has movable pieces that could cause injury. Also, please be mindful of mouthing, choking, and swallowing risks when small polished stones are handed out. Exchanges for larger stones can be made after the show.
